YEAR ONE

- Observation and recording first-hand
 experiences
- Drawing, painting and mixed-media techniques
- Artist research and analysis.

YEAR TWO

Preparatory studies:

- Artist research
- Visual recording
- Creative experimentation and personal ideas development.

ASSESSMENT

Your studies in Fine Art are assessed via a combination of assessment methods including:

- Portfolio work including a personal study
- 15 hour exam

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

At least five GCSEs at grade 5 or above including English Language and Art.

A suitable portfolio of artwork may be accepted as an alternative to GCSE Art.

PROGRESSION POSSIBILITIES

CAREERS: Fine artist, illustrator, architect, animator, set-designer, museum/gallery worker and commercial artist.

UNIVERSITY STUDY: Art Foundation (pre-degree), Fine Art, Illustration, Architecture, Art History, Interior Design and Animation.
